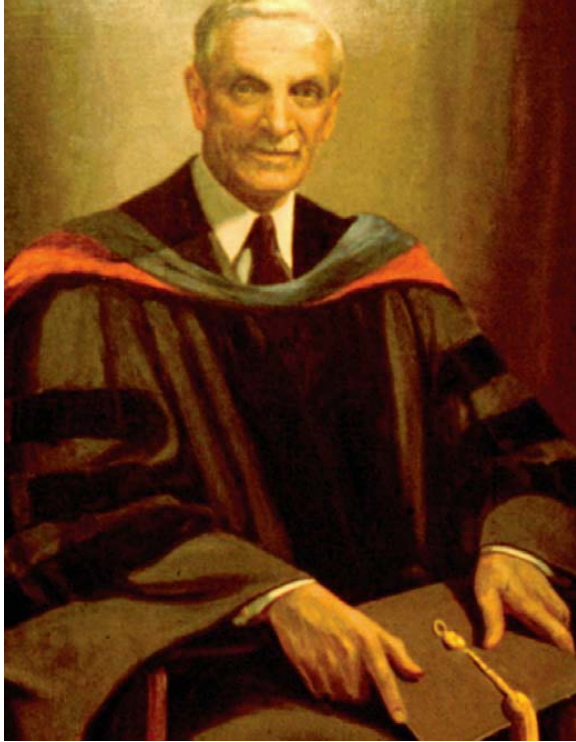




**GOODALE, DR. HUBERT D. 1879-1968**

A. B. 1903 and A.M. 1904, Trinity College and Ph.D., Columbia University 1913. Genetics research at Columbia, "Oakwood", and Cold Spring Harbor, 1905-1913. Research biologist in Poultry Husbandry at Massachusetts Agricultural Experiment Station, 1913- 1922. Geneticist and biologist, Mount Hope Farm, 1922-1962. World-renowned pioneer in poultry genetics and breeding. Member of Poultry Science Association and many other scientific organizations. Fellow of Poultry Science Association, 1954. Poultry Hall of Fame, 1956.



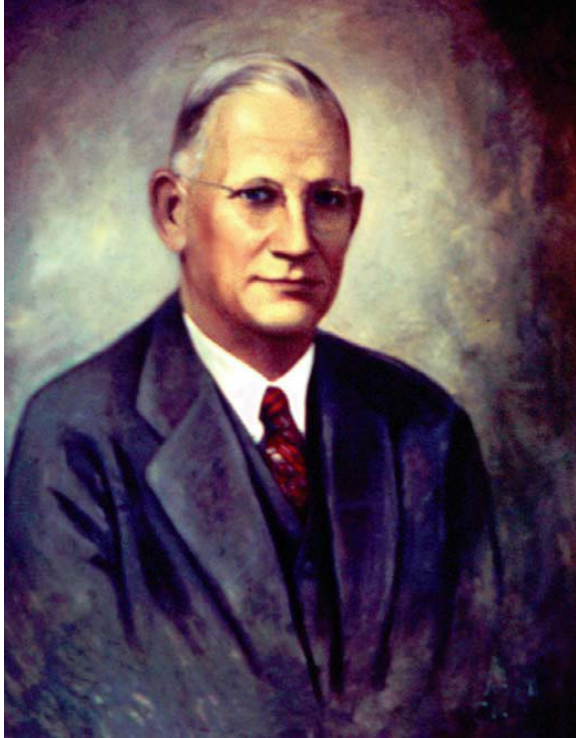
**JULL, DR. MORLEY A. 1885-1959**

B.S.A. Ontario Agricultural College, 1908. M.S. McGill University, 1914 and Ph.D. University of Wisconsin, 1921. Head of Poultry Department, MacDonald College, 1912-1923; USDA Senior Poultry Husbandman, 1923- 1936, Head of the Poultry Department, University of Maryland, 1936-1955. An outstanding teacher, research worker and administrator for nearly 45 years. He gained a world-wide reputation as an author of textbooks, scientific and popular articles in the poultry field. Poultry Science Association President, 1915-1916, Fellow 1936 and Teaching Award 1950. Jull Hall and the Morley A. Jull, Sr. Memorial Fund honor his memory at the University of Maryland. Poultry Hall of Fame, 1956.



**KEMPSTER, PROFESSOR HARRY L. 1884-1962**

B.S. Michigan State College, 1909 and M.S. University of Wisconsin, 1928. Poultry instructor, Michigan State, 1909-1911. Professor of Poultry Husbandry and Chairman of the Department at the University of Missouri, 1911-1954. Teacher and research investigator 1909-1962. He taught more than 6,000 students. Many became leaders in science and industry. Poultry Science Association, President 1940-1941, Fellow, 1938 and Teaching Award, 1951. Kempster Memorial Fund which provides scholarships for poultry students commemorates his memory at the University of Missouri. Poultry Hall of Fame, 1956.



**PHILIPS, ALLEN G. 1886-1952**

B. S. Kansas State College, 1907. Poultry Instructor Purdue University 1910-1918 and Head of Department 1918-1926. Vice President and general sales manager, Allied Mills, 1926-1951. "Chick" was a dynamic leader in both poultry science and industry and his spirit of cooperation brought college workers and feed industry leaders closer together. A pioneer investigator in the use of soybean oil meal for poultry. U. S. delegate to the World's Poultry Congress in Spain in 1924. President Poultry Science Association, 1916-1918, Fellow, 1952. Poultry Hall of Fame, 1956.
