



BILLINGS, DR. WILLIAM A. 1888-1970

D.V.M. Cornell University, 1918, Pathologist and Extension Veterinarian in Minnesota, 1918-1956. He developed the "Minnesota Plan" of practical procedures in turkey production. He developed a widely quoted series of "Turkey Talk" Bulletins and a newsletter "Talking Turkey". He was recognized as an authority on turkey management and was invited to speak in all 48 states and Canada. He was an honorary life member of the National Turkey Federation and the Minnesota Turkey Federation. Received the USDA Award of Merit. Poultry Hall of Fame, 1962.



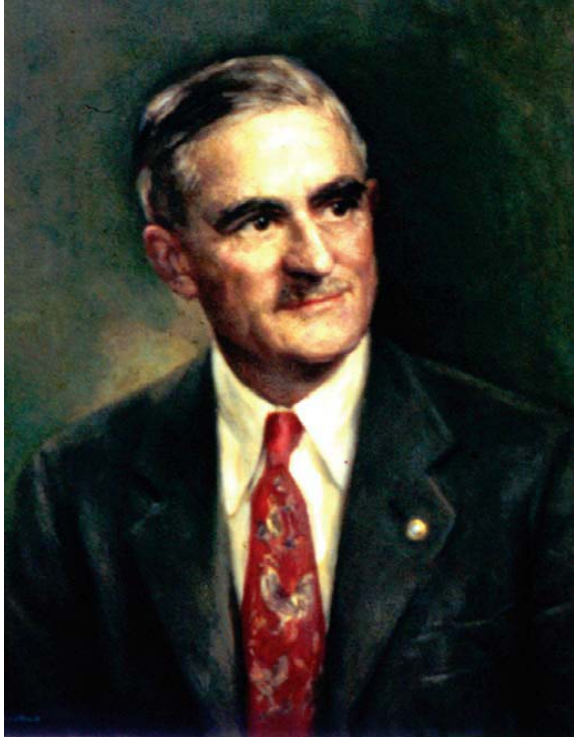
KENT, O. B. 1890-1956

B.S. Cornell, 1913 M.S. Cornell, 1914 Ph.D. Cornell, 1917 Cornell, Instructor, 1913- 1917; Assistant Professor, 1917-1920; Professor, 1920-1922. Quaker Oats Company; Poultry and livestock specialist, 1922-1946 and Director of Research 1946-1956. An authority in poultry nutrition and management. President, Poultry Science Association, 1920-1921, and editor, 1921-1922. President American Poultry Historical Society, 1955. Active participant in World's Poultry Congresses, 1933, 1936, 1948 and 1954. Poultry Hall of Fame, 1962



PIERCE, HOWARD C. 1882-1967

B.S. Cornell, 1907. Head of Poultry Department, Iowa State, 1907-1910. Investigator, Food Research Laboratory U.S.D.A. 1910- 1919. Industry positions 1919-1927. Poultry buyer and Director of Research A & P Food Stores 1927-1960. Pioneer in quality improvement of shell eggs and egg products. A leader in the "Chicken of Tomorrow Contests" which stimulated the development of meat type broilers. Franklin L. Sewell Citation, 1950. Charter member of Poultry Science Association and Secretary-Treasurer, 1910-1911. Poultry Hall of Fame, 1962.



CHRISTIE, ANDREW 1888-1964

Born in Albania, April 15, 1888. "Andy" was known throughout the United States and many foreign countries as the breeder and developer of a meat or broiler strain of New Hampshires. He was active in state and national poultry organizations serving as president of the New Hampshire Baby Chick Association, the New Hampshire Club, the New Hampshire Poultry Growers Association, the American Poultry and Hatchery Federation and the Poultry and Egg National Board. He was also active in civic and church affairs serving as a member of the Kingston, New Hampshire, School Committee for 33 years, president of his Rotary Club, member of the New Hampshire State Planning Commission for 10 years, life trustee of the Kingston Congregational Church and many other activities.
