



HANKE, OSCAR AUGUST, 1902-1989

B.S., Agricultural Journalism, Univ. of Wisconsin, 1926. Honorary degree, Carthage College, Kenosha, Wisconsin, 1954. Author, editor and editorial director of Watt Publishing Company for 41 years (1926-67). Active in the poultry industry, civic and church affairs for more than 50 years. Member of the organizing committees for the National Turkey Federation and the Poultry and Egg National Board. Raised thousands of dollars in support of World's Poultry Congresses and for poultry research. Honored for distinguished service by the University of Wisconsin Journalism Institute, 1970; Industry Service Award, Institute of American Poultry Industries, 1961; honorary member, National Turkey Federation. President of APHS, 1969- 70. Poultry Hall of Fame, 1971.



**HENNINGSEN, VICTOR WILLIAM, SR. 1895-
2007**

Completed 2-year course, University of Nebraska, 1916. Manager, Director and President of Henningsen Inc. and Henningsen Foods, Inc., 1916-1961. Chairman of the Board, 1961 to date. He pioneered the freezing of eggs in China in 1917, developed spray drying innovations for eggs, promoted research and development leading to the production of egg products free of pathogens through pasteurization (1936). Henningsen's Laboratories were heavily involved in the development of glucose-free whole egg solids, low moisture gas packed dried eggs and the early application of enzyme desugaring. Served as director and president of several national egg products and poultry organizations. Received the IAPI Service Award in 1967. Poultry Hall of Fame 1971.



JEWELL, JESSE DICKSON 1893-1975

Attended Georgia Tech, 1920 and the University of Alabama, 1922; left college to help his widowed mother operate a feed and fertilizer business. He pioneered the development of the nation's modern meat chicken industry; vertical integration, bulk feeding, feed conversion contracts, better packaging, new products, aggressive merchandizing and the production and use of by-products. Served as first president and board chairman of the National Broiler Council (1954-57); President, Southeastern Poultry & Egg Assn. (1949); President Georgia Chamber of Commerce (1955); Chairman, Board of Trustees, Brenau College, Gainesville, Georgia and many other responsible positions. Poultry Hall of Fame, 1971.



MARTIN, JOSEPH HOLMES, 1895-1977

B.S.A. Purdue University, 1917; M.S. University of Kentucky, 1924 and Ph.D. University of Wisconsin, 1929. Leader in teaching, research and public service for more than 50 years. Head of the Poultry Department University of Kentucky, 1922-38 and Purdue University, 1940-62. Director, U.S. Regional Poultry Research Laboratory, East Lansing, Michigan, 1938-40. Secretary-Treasurer Poultry Science Assn., 1926-31; Editor Poultry Science 1931-35 and Fellow Poultry Science. More than 80 poultry publications and co-author of *Turkey Management*. He has served as advisor to many national and international poultry organizations. Poultry Hall of Fame, 1971.



WARREN, DON CAMERON, 1890-1994

A.B. Indiana University, 1914; M.A., 1917 and Ph.D. Columbia University, 1923. Dr. Warren spent 59 years (1909-68) in teaching, research and public service. He is a member of Gamma Sigma Delta, Sigma Xi, Phi Kappa Phi, Poultry Science Association and other scientific associations. He served as president of the Poultry Science Association, 1941-44. He is an eminent poultry geneticist with experience in both academic and commercial fields. He received the Poultry Science Research Award in 1933, the Borden Award in 1940 and the USDA Superior Service Award (1954). Elected a Poultry Science Fellow (1938) and Poultry Hall of Fame, 1971.
