



BRANION, DR. HUGH D., 1906-1977

University of Toronto, B.A. 1928, M.A. 1929, PhD, 1933. Dr. Branion served the Poultry and Nutrition Departments at the Ontario Agricultural College from 1930-64. After that he was Dean of the Graduate School and later assistant to the President. He served the Poultry Industry of Canada for 44 years as teacher, researcher and administrator publishing more than 200 articles dealing with nutrition. After 4 years as associate editor, he served as Editor of Poultry Science, 1949-77. He then served as director and president of the Association. He was named a fellow by the Chemical Institute of Canada, the Agricultural Institute of Canada and the Poultry Science Assn. Poultry Hall of Fame, 1974.



HUTTAR, JOHN C., 1901-1988

Cornell University B.S. 1924, PhD. 1928. Dr. Huttar helped organize and was active in PENB (President 1950-51), NEPPCO (President 1932-36), New York State Poultry Council (Man of the Year 1955) and SPICE. Dr. Huttar was a supreme organizer and cohesive factor in advancing the poultry industry of the New England states. He was an instructor in Poultry Husbandry at Cornell from 1924-31 and Director of Poultry Management for GLF and Agway Inc. from 1932-66. He was named a Distinguished Alumnus in 1965, cited by the Poultryman in 1935, and Good Egg Club in 1950, I.A.P.I. in 1962 and has been active in church industry and civic organizations for more than 50 years. PRINGLE, WILLIAM V., 1903-1969

Born in Missouri and reared in Kansas, Mr. Pringle was one of the first to market eviscerated poultry and to export poultry meat products. In 1965 he exported the first containerized poultry products. He was organizer and General Manager of the Rockingham Virginia Poultry Marketing Cooperative from 1940-68. Mr. Pringle was an officer in many Virginia organizations. He was founder and later President of the Southeastern Poultry and Egg Association, and he served as Chairman of the Board of the I. A. P. I. A great believer in the organizational approach to getting things done, "Vic" Pringle held offices in many civic and trade associations. Poultry Hall of Fame, 1974.



SCOTT, HAROLD M., 1901-1993

B.S. Oregon State College, 1924, M.S. Kansas State College, 1927, and Ph.D. University of Illinois, 1938. Dr. Scott served University Poultry Departments at North Dakota State College 1927-1928, Kansas State College 1928- 1936, University of Connecticut 1941-1947 and University of Illinois 1948-1969. He authored more than 200 scientific articles. Awards: American Feed Manufacturers Assn., 1955; President Poultry Science Assn., 1948, Fellow, 1957; Bordon Award, 1963; Distinguished Nutritionist (Distillers Feed Research Council, 1964, Teaching Award Poultry Science, 1969; Fellow American Institute of Nutrition, 1970. Poultry Hall of Fame, 1974.



WINTER, ALDEN R., 1898-

B.A. West Virginia University, 1920; Ohio State University, M.S., 1921, Ph.D. , 1929. Dr. Winter has a distinguished career in teaching, research and industry service. His research dealt with pullorum disease, pasteurization and freezing liquid eggs, cleaning shell eggs, nutritional properties of compost litter and preservation of poultry products. He was honored by PENB in 1954, Fellow Poultry Science Assn. 1962, Distinguished Research Award (Distillers' Research Council) 1964, and Centennial Award for agricultural education (Ohio State University) 1970. He served at Ohio State University from 1920-1964 (department chairman, 1955-64). He was Poultry Advisor for AID in India from 1964-67. Poultry Hall of Fame, 1974.
