



FORSYTHE, RICHARD H. 1921—

B.S. and Ph.D., Iowa State. A native of Iowa, Dr. Forsythe became a world-renowned teacher and researcher in food technology. He developed successful procedures for egg washing, drying egg albumen, and pasteurization of liquid eggs. He assisted in development of the Egg Products Inspection Act and has served on numerous U. S. and world industry organizations, and committees representing both industry and government. President U.S.A. Branch WPS, Fellow of the Institute of Food Technologists, key organizer of the 15th World's Poultry Congress. Poultry Hall of Fame 1989.



HOGUE, ROBERT L. 1913-2000

A native of Ohio and a graduate of Purdue University (B.S. - 1936), Mr. Hogue has given a lifetime of dedication to many facets of the Poultry Industry. He has served as a stimulus to 4-H poultry programs, coordinated disease control and marketing programs, encouraged consumer enlightenment, and provided an organizational hub for industry, university and governmental interests throughout the U.S. as well as representing the U.S. at many foreign poultry activities. Recognized for his efforts by P.S. Extension Teaching Award, Indiana Golden Egg Award, P.E.N.B. Red Rooster Award, PS/APHS Historic Preservation Award, and Purdue University Distinguished Alumni Award. Poultry Hall of Fame 1989.



SHAVER, DONALD McQUEEN 1920 -

Born in Galt, Ontario, Canada. A graduate of Galt Institute '37, he served in the Canadian army 1939-46 (at age 25, Lt. Col. Shaver was the youngest officer to command a Canadian regiment). In 1946 he founded Shaver Poultry Breeding Farm and soon was recognized as an international leader in his field. He followed the sale of his stock with business advice and guidance to his franchises and purchasers. Honors include: life member of both Poultry Science Assn. and World's Poultry Science Assn.; honorary Sc.D., McGill University; the Order of Canada, Canadian Award for Export Excellence; Canadian Agricultural Poultry Hall of Fame, and International Poultry Hall of Fame. American Poultry Hall of Fame 1989.



SKINNER, JOHN L. 1924 –

A Nebraska native, B.S. Univ. of Nebraska, M.S. Texas A & M, employment in industry and universities (Emeritus Prof. University of Wisconsin). Upon his love of fancy chickens, Skinner built a career of education and information useful to a 11 facets of the industry. By the written word and the practical example, he addressed the needs of youth, fanciers, home flock owners, and commercial producers. A licensed poultry judge, editor of the Standard of Perfection, recorder of poultry history, his honors include Fellow of Poultry Science, honorary lifetime director APHS, Pfizer Extension Teaching Award, PS/APHS History Preservation Award, Extension Meritorious Service and Second Mile Awards. American Poultry Hall of Fame 1989.



WATT, LESLIE A. 1913-2008

A native of Illinois (B.A., U. of IL at age 19), Mr. Watt spent more than 50 years in the agricultural publishing field associated with many of America's leading poultry journals. He devoted his life to expanding the knowledge and information base available to the poultry industry _worldwide. His activities included: President, Agricultural Publishers Assn., 1947-1949; Founder and President, Farm Publication Reports, 1948-1949; Director, Audit Bureau of Circulations, 1949-1959; Director, National Business Publications, 1961-1964; Director, Business Publications Audit of Circulations, 1967-1970; Organizational Director of American Business Press, 1965-1968; Chairman of Promotion and Publicity, for the USA Participation Committee, 1970 World's Poultry Congress; opened poultry information avenues into China with the China Edition of Poultry International; Poultry Hall of Fame, 1989.
