Government administrator with extensive background and insight into the industry's makeup and problems, he blended the forces of USDA and industry into workable and acceptable programs. A native of North Carolina. B.S. 1954 North Carolina State. Employed in Poultry Division USDA 32 years where he rose to the position of Division Director. A member of Poultry Science Association and the American Poultry Historical Society, he has developed many of the regulations and guidelines that serve the producer and the consumer in the inspection and standardization of poultry, eggs and egg products. Recognized with many Certificates of Merit Awards by USDA he received the Superior Service Award and the Presidential award a "Meritorious Executive". Public Service Award National Broiler Council. MAY, KENNETH N., 1930-

Teacher, researcher and key executive in the broiler industry as it moved to become the country's most desirable and most consumed meal. He taught at University of Georgia and Mississippi State University before moving to Industry in 1970 where he became chairman and CEO of Holly Farms, and since 1988 has served as technical advisor to National Broiler Council as well as director of two other large poultry organizations. May past president of Poultry Science Association, World's Poultry Science Association, Institute of Food Technologists, Association of Southern Agricultural Workers, member and past president of American Poultry Historical Society. Worked extensively in government/industry advisory liaison roles. Fellow of Poultry science, Honorary Doctor of Agriculture (Purdue University) adjunct Professor of Poultry Science, North Carolina University, Poultry Hall of Fame, 1992.



STADELMAN, WILLIAM J., 1917-2007

Teacher, researcher and widely acclaimed products technologist. A native of Washington, B.S. 1940 Washington State University, M.S. 1942 Ph.D. 1948 Pennsylvania State University. Stadelman is recognized nationally and internationally as an expert in egg nutrition, egg products and poultry meat products. Employed at Washington State 1948-1955 and at Purdue University 1955-1983 it is acknowledged that more than 75% of the poultry food technologists can trace their training back to him. Member: Poultry Science Association, Institute of technologists World's Poultry Science Food Association, American Association for Advancement of Science, and many other scientific bodies, Stadelman has been elected Fellow of four scientific societies, received Ralston Purina Teaching Award, Christee Award from National Egg Board, Served in the Navy in World War II, authored more than 200 scientific papers, all or part of 7 books. SUNDE, MILTON L., 1921-

Teacher, researcher, nutritionist. A native of South Dakota, B.S. South Dakota State College 1947, M.S. 1949. Ph.D. 1950 University of Wisconsin. Staff member of Poultry Science Department University of Wisconsin 1949-1987. Sunde distinguished himself as a very practical teacher with a wealth of research experience and hands on approach to industry problems. Member and past president of Poultry Science Association Member and past President of American Poultry Historical Society, Chairman of National Research Council Poultry Nutrition Committee, Associate Editor of Poultry Science Journal. Boy Scout leader. FFA advisor. An infantry officer in World War II. Fellow of Poultry Science Association, recipient of Ralston Purina Teaching Award. University of Wisconsin teaching Award.
